


#### TASK FOR KEY QUESTIONING

- How can critical thinking help us move beyond these single stories to create more inclusive communities?





## TASK FOR COMPREHENSION READ YOUR ARTICLE AND ANSWER

- What key issue or argument is the article presenting, and how does it relate to themes like tolerance, inclusiveness, or boundaries within communities?
- What assumptions or perspectives does the author bring to the topic? Are there any biases, and how might they affect the article's message?
- How could the ideas or issues discussed in the article be applied or seen in your own community? Can you think of examples where similar situations or values are present?
- How might critical thinking help communities address the issues raised in the article? What specific critical thinking skills would be valuable?

## HOW HAS YOUR PERCEPTION CHANGED?


Choose a card that represents a particular community concept, such as tolerance, confrontation, boundaries, inclusiveness, tradition, or innovation.


How does the image symbolize the concept you chose? How does your card connect to the community theme?

## TASKS FOR DECISION MAKING & ACTING

### ARGUE FOR/AGAINST

- Should local governments prioritize inclusiveness in public spaces, even if it means changing long-standing traditions?
- Should schools and community centers promote cultural traditions that may not represent all members of the community?
- What are the potential benefits and drawbacks of the policy?
- How does the policy impact tolerance and inclusiveness?
- What alternative perspectives or solutions could be considered?
- How can critical thinking help evaluate the policy's impact on the community?









• Identify and analyze the impact of "single stories" and stereotypes on community relations.

 Reflect on personal and community experiences where limited perceptions influenced understanding or interactions.

- Apply critical thinking to evaluate media, literature, and real-world examples that influence community dynamics.
- Facilitate meaningful discussions on topics like tolerance, inclusiveness, confrontation, and tradition within communities.
- Critically assess arguments and perspectives in written texts, identifying assumptions, biases, and their implications for inclusiveness and boundaries in communities.
- Use creative tools, like Dixit cards, to explore and express community concepts such as tolerance, boundaries, tradition, and innovation.
- Develop and articulate reasoned arguments for or against community policies, considering their impact on inclusiveness, traditions, and community cohesion.
